How this whole thing got started...

Arghh Carolinas District!! In order to truly understand what it means to be a Circle Ker you need to know how Circle K transformed into the organization it is today.

Here's a brief timeline covering some major milestones in our history!

1949: Circle K

becomes an international organization with the chartering of a club at the University of Western Ontario.

1955:

CKI recives official recognition and a charter from Kiwanis International Constitution and Bylaws

also adopted.

1962:

Carolinas District Chartered! By May of this year, CKI had a membership of 7,700 and 402 clubs.

2006:

The International Trustee system was replaced with International Representatives. Districts are broken down into Sub-Regions by location. A Representative is elected from each Sub-Region (A-G).

CKI announces its international fundraiser, Saving Lives: The Six Cents Initiative, which focuses on getting clean water to children who need it most.
